TAPPING PLAYBOOK

BENEFITS OF TAPPING

Tapping, also known as Emotional Freedom Technique (EFT) is a powerful techique for processing difficult emotions. Rather than being forced to choose between repressing/ignoring your emotions or being overwhelmed by them, tapping enables you to diffuse your difficult feelings and move on lighter and more free.

There are numerous benefits to tapping. Here are a few:

- It calms the fight or flight nervous system.
- It activates the rest and digest nervous system.
- It disconnects thoughts and emotions from the fight or flight reactions they cause in the body.
- It regulates cortisol levels.

STEP 1. IDENTIFY YOUR MOST PRESSING ISSUE

Although many people are in the habit of "thinking positive" and minimizing or ignoring their negative emotions, just as you have to focus on the dirt in order to clean your house, tapping works best if you can "feel into" your negative emotions for a few moments before you start.

If you are finding this difficult, spend a few moments taking some deep breaths, imagining that your breath is a like a bellows that is fanning the flame of your feelings enough for you to clearly identify both the nature of the emotion and its location in your body.

Once you've made contact with the emotion, express your most pressing issue (MPI) in a sentence or two, being as explicit and detailed as possible. Your MPI should ring true and feel powerful to you.

For example, you will get a better effect working with the MPI "ever since I spoke to my ex-husband on the phone it has felt like there was an elephant sitting on my chest" than the MPI "I am upset at my ex-husband".

STEP 2. MEASURE THE INTENSITY (SUDS)

Get in touch with your MPI and stir up as much emotional intensity as you can by breathing into the emotion. Give your emotions an intensity rating (or subjective units of distress scale - SUDS) between 0 and 10. A zero rating would be no intensity at all while a 10 rating would be as intense as you can possibly imagine. Don't stress about getting the SUDS level exact -- just go with your first instinct and write that number down.

STEP 3. CRAFT A SET-UP STATEMENT



The set up statement serves to focus your

attention on your MPI. The basic set-up statement goes like this:

Even though I [briefly describe your MPI], I deeply and completely love and accept myself.

(Some people find that this phrase feels uncomfortable or inauthentic for one reason or another. If that is the case for you, there is a list of alternative statements on pages 2-4.)

STEP 4. PICK A REMINDER PHRASE

The reminder phrase serves to keep your attention focused on your MPI as you tap through the points. It can be one or two words, just enough to keep you focused on the issue at hand.

The other option is just to "vent" aloud about the issue as you tap, voicing whatever thoughts and feelings come to mind.

STEP 5. PREPARE TO TAP

Take off your glasses, your watch, and any other jewelry or clothing that might get in the way.

STEP 6. TAP!

While tapping on the karate chop point (point locations are described in detail on page 2) on your non-dominant hand with three or four fingers of your dominant hand, say your set-up statement aloud three times (with emphasis and emotion).

Use the tips of the index and middle fingers of your dominant hand to tap gently but firmly approximately 10-15 times on each point (on whichever side of the body is easiest to reach) in this order while saying your reminder phrase or "venting" aloud about your MPI:

- Eyebrow
- Side of eye
- Under eye
- Under nose
- Chin
- Collarbone
- Underarm
- Top of head

STEP 7. RE-RATE YOUR SUDS

Pause and breathe for a few moments. Get in touch with your MPI and, once again, stir up as much emotional intensity as you can. Give your emotions another SUDS rating. If your SUDS is still 2 or above, think about whether your set-up statement could be refined, adjusted, and/or made more specific.

STEP 8. START OVER AGAIN AT STEP #6


Repeat until you feel a sense of peace and resolution.

TAPPING POINT LOCATIONS

KARATE CHOP POINT:

On the outside of the hand, about an inch below the base of the pinky finger.



EYEBROW POINT:

At the end of your eyebrow closest to your nose.

SIDE OF EYE POINT:

On the bony rim on the outside of the eye.

UNDER EYE POINT:

On the bony rim directly underneath the pupil.

UNDER NOSE POINT:

At the midpoint of a line between the underside of the nose and the upper lip.

CHIN POINT:

In the cleft of the chin, midway between the lower lip and the tip of the chin.


COLLARBONE POINT:

To find this point, place your index finger in the U-shaped notch at the top of the breastbone (where a man would knot a tie) then move the finger down one inch (toward the navel) and one to two inches to either side until it falls into a tender depression.

UNDERARM POINT:

About four inches beneath the center of the armpit, approximately where a bra strap would fall.
